Dear PCPH Family and Friends:

We have been happily mortgage-free since 2010. Now we are tasked with maintaining our facilities in the best and safest manner. Your Session and members of the Operations/Property Ministry have identified several special needs related to our beautiful church and campus. The Property Ministry's needs and property upkeep are separate from the expenses funded under the Operating Budget, which is supported by the annual giving. Listed below are the recognized essentials developed by the Property Ministry that need to be addressed in 2018.

- \$9,000 to replace one remaining large, sanctuary air conditioning unit. All others have been replaced.
- \$5,000 to replace four rusting doors at various locations on campus. These are exterior, metal doors and must meet more stringent building code requirements, which is one of the reasons they are more expensive to replace.
- \$2,000 to repair pavement, including the very obvious pot holes
- \$9,500 to re-seal and re-stripe the parking lot
- \$400 required at signing the termite protection. (Renewal costs will be budgeted in the Operations budget.)
- \$57,000 to replace the 16 year old sanctuary roofing system

Funding these specific property needs will be addressed in early 2018. If you have any questions, contact me, Linda Burton or any other member of the Finance or Property Ministries.
